# (a) <u>Action Items</u>

(i) Almaguin Community Htchery Program re: Request for donation of \$500.00 Res. No. 11(a)(i)/14/01/2022 Mike Rickward, Liz Stermsek

**WHEREAS** the Almaguin Community Hatchery Program (ACHP), run by a dedicated group of volunteers, is focused on restoring the Walleye population within the Magnetawan River System of the Almaguin area;

AND WHEREAS a new approach taken, has resulted in the development of a mobile hatchery; AND WHEREAS the ACHP presently has two micro hatcheries in Almaguin, (one in the Magnetawan Public School and the other in the Almaguin Highlands Secondary School) and would like to introduce an on-line education component which requires technical equipment at an estimated cost of \$10,000.00;

AND WHEREAS a request has been received from the Almaguin Community Hatchery Program, for a donation in the amount of \$500.00 to assist with the purchase of this equipment for the mobile hatchery;

**NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Kearney shall... **DEFERRED** 

(ii) **Township of Southgate re**: Request for support of Resolution – Annual Emergency Exercise Requirement

WHEREAS Ontario Regulation 380/04: Standards under the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act sets the municipal standards for emergency management programs in Ontario and requires municipalities to conduct an annual exercise with their Emergency Control Group in order to evaluate the municipality's emergency response plan and procedures, O. Reg. 380/04, s.12(6);

**AND WHEREAS** Emergency Management Ontario previously granted municipalities exemption for the annual exercise requirement when the municipality experienced an actual emergency with documented proof of the municipality actively engaging their emergency management procedures and plan in response to the emergency;

**AND WHEREAS** on August 5, 2021 the Chief, Emergency Management Ontario issued a memo to Community Emergency Management Co-ordinators stating that effective immediately, the Chief, EMO would no longer be issuing exemptions to the *O. Reg. 380/04* requirement to conduct an annual exercise;

**AND WHEREAS** municipalities experience significant costs and burden to staff resources when faced with the response to an actual emergency and activation of their Emergency Control Group and/or Emergency Operations Centre;

**AND WHEREAS** a municipality's response to an actual emergency is more effective than an exercise in evaluating its emergency response plan and procedures as mandated by *O. Reg.* 380/04;

AND WHEREAS planning, conducting and evaluating an emergency exercise requires significant time and effort for the Community Emergency Management Co-ordinator and Municipal Emergency Control Group, that is duplicated when the municipality experiences a real emergency;

NOW THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Kearney hereby requests the Province of Ontario to amend *Ontario Regulation 380/04* under the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* to provide an exemption to the annual exercise requirement for municipalities that have activated their Emergency Control Group and/or Emergency Response Plan in response to an actual emergency that year, in recognition of the significant resources used to respond to the emergency and the effectiveness of such response in evaluating the municipality's emergency response plan and procedures;

**AND FURTHER** that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honourable Doug Ford, Premier of Ontario; the Honourable Steve Clark, Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing; the Honourable Sylvia Jones, Solicitor General; and, Norm Miller, MPP for Parry Sound – Muskoka.
